"SERVE THE LORD"?



First of all, we must realize that

THIS IS "SLAVE TERMINOLOGY"!

THESE ARE "MASTER-SLAVE" WORDS!



Never be lacking in zeal, but keep your spiritual fervor, serving the Lord.

- "SERVING" (Greek: δουλεύω) = "TO SERVE," to do the work of a slave.
- "LORD" (Greek: κύριος) = "MASTER," one who has authority over others.

This New Testament Greek word can be translated as either 'master" or "lord." (Translators must decide which to use; and they normally choose "Lord," when referring to Jesus.) People seem to have forgotten that "Lord" means "Master"!

Never be lacking in zeal, but keep your spiritual fervor, serving the Lord.

 This verse describes our relationship to Jesus as that of a <u>slave</u> to a <u>master</u>.

Scripture uses a variety of terms to describe us.

They all point to different aspects of our relationship to our Creator and Savior. (Other examples: brother, friend, image of God, free, etc.)

A SLAVE OF JESUS!

"SERVING the MASTER, Jesus Christ"

Today, people often have difficulty accepting this concept.

- Some just don't want to give up the "rights" they think they have to sin.
 - ✓ In reality, NOBODY has a "right" to sin. Not even atheists.
- Many don't think that "serving" is mandatory.
 - √ The Bible tells us that God's people those truly saved will want to obey and serve him.
 - The "false gospel" that many preach tends to ignore repentance (and obedience), and deceives people into thinking they can remain in sin <u>and</u> consider themselves saved.

• Still others think that the "master-slave" concept implies things they are unwilling to accept.

THE LIE: 1) there is only ONE kind of slavery,
2) it is ALWAYS EVIL and 3) should be avoided.

They believe the world's lie about what "slavery" is; so they consider it offensive to apply the concept to Jesus!





If you listen to the BIBLE, you will realize that there are MANY kinds of slavery.

RANGING FROM...



EVIL situations, where those causing it deserve the severest of punishments ...

Kidnappers <u>must be killed</u>, whether they are caught in possession of their victims or have already sold them as slaves.

Exodus 21:16 (NLT)

ALL THE WAY TO...



GOOD situations that even the *slave* desired to be in.

But if your slave says to you, 'I don't want to leave you,' because he loves you and your family, and is well off with you, ...

Deut. 15:16 (HCSB)

The issue is not the **EXISTENCE** of slavery, but the **CONDUCT** of those involved.

YOU MAY ASK (and it's a good question):

WHAT DOES ALL THIS HAVE TO DO WITH ME?

There are <u>MANY</u> types of "master-slave" relationships

 situations in which <u>one person</u> does work for another.

Most of us are involved in one or more such relationships (hopefully good ones) – <u>though</u> we use other words to describe it.

But there is <u>ONE</u> "master-slave" relationship that affects *everyone* ...

Including YOU.

There is one matter in which the Bible guarantees 100% that:

YOU ARE A SLAVE.

This is A FACT worth repeating:

In this matter, **YOU ARE A SLAVE.**

Only ONE QUESTION remains:



This is also worth repeating:

WHO is your master?

Is it **SIN?** or **OBEDIENCE** (to God)?

Don't you realize that whatever you choose to obey becomes your master?

You can choose sin, which leads to death, or you can choose to obey God and receive his approval.

Romans 6:16 (NLT)

GOD'S PEOPLE have been <u>set free</u> from their old master, <u>to serve</u> a new one!

Thank God!

Once you were slaves of sin, but now you have obeyed with all your heart the new teaching God has given you.

Now you are free from sin, your old master, and you have become slaves to your new master, righteousness.

Romans 6:17-18 (NLT)









The REWARDS that OBEDIENCE offers you: (YOUR MASTER!) YOU GET: But now that you have been set free from sin and have become slaves to God, the benefit you reap leads to holiness, and the result is eternal life. Romans 6:22 (NIV)

Here's another difference in the REWARDS:

- When <u>SIN</u> is your master ...
 - your rewards are EARNED.
- When <u>OBEDIENCE TO GOD</u> is your master ... your rewards are GIFTED.

For the <u>wages of sin</u> is death, but the <u>gift of God</u> is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Romans 6:23 (NIV)

In ROMANS 7 & 8: We learn about our "possibilities" and our "impossibilities"

- 1) Our obedience is **possible** only through Jesus Christ, by the power of God.
 - (The <u>salvation</u> that makes obedience possible is <u>also a GIFT</u>! Ephesians 2:8.)
- It is impossible to choose sin as your master <u>and also</u> be saved.
 (It's "either-or.")

THE BIBLE HAS A LOT TO SAY ABOUT MASTER-SLAVE RELATIONSHIPS.

For today, we will conclude with this:

BEING JESUS' SLAVE WASN'T A PROBLEM FOR THE EARLY CHRISTIANS! "This letter is from Paul, Jesus Christ's slave" ... Romans 1:1 (NLT) IT SHOULDN'T BE A PROBLEM FOR US! * Some translations use the word "servant"; but the word means "slave."

Jesus offers you FREEDOM from sin, so that you can SERVE him, instead of sin. THERE IS NO GREATER PRIVILEGE IN ALL OF CREATION! DON'T THROW AWAY YOUR OPPORTUNITY!

WHO IS YOUR MASTER?

"**SERVING**" (Greek: δουλεύω) = "TO SERVE," to do the work of a slave.

"LORD" (Greek: κύριος) = "MASTER," one who has authority over others.

The phrase "serving the Lord" focuses on the master-slave relationship we have with the "King of Kings and Lord of Lords" (1 Timothy 6:15; Revelation 17:14; 19:16). We will have that relationship for all eternity. See Revelation 22:3, "his servants will serve him." [The word "servant" (Greek: δ o $\hat{U}\lambda$ o ς) is normally translated as "slave."]

There are many dimensions to our relationship with Jesus. Other concepts are also used to describe it, such as "friend" (John 15:15). But these other ways that we relate to Jesus do *not* cancel the master-slave relationship described in Romans 12:11. [This is illustrated in John 15. Only a few verses after Jesus called the apostles "friends" (v. 15), he again refers to the master-slave relationship (v. 20).]

 Remember that Jesus is infinitely superior to you, and deserves to be served 100% of the time - John 15:20a.

Your "Job Description"

You will either serve God or something else... it can't be both:

See Matthew 6:24. This verse applies the principle to "God vs. possessions"; but the principle itself applies to *anything* we might exalt above God.

WHAT you should do:

- Serve God (Jesus Christ), who is your master Romans 12:11.
- Serve him faithfully Matthew 24:45-46; 25:19-23.
- Don't be a lazy, wicked servant Matthew 25:24-30.

Serving the Lord (Master) is an all-the-time activity. Our only other option is to serve sin and the devil. (We can try to serve *ourselves*; but in the end, all we've accomplished is to serve the devil - the one who gave us the temptation to serve ourselves.)

HOW you should do it: By fulfilling your obligation to love:

- Love God with all that you have and are (Matthew 22:37-38).
 If you love God, you will obey him (John 14:23-24; 1 John 5:3).
 This includes living a morally pure life.
- Love your neighbor as yourself (Matthew 22:39). This may include serving others (1 Peter 4:10).

REMEMBER THAT JESUS IS "LORD OF LORDS."

This means he is "Master over all other masters."

- - - - - - - - -

If you are someone who has authority over other people (= the basic definition of "master"), remember that you have a Master over you, who will judge you for the way you treat those who are under your authority. Do not mistreat them!

One other use for the word "lord" (master) - In some verses, this word is used as a title of respect, similar to our use the word "Sir." The context of these verses makes it obvious. (Examples: John 4:11, 15, 19.)
