
Furthermore, just as they did not think it worthwhile to retain the knowledge of God, so God gave them over to a depraved mind, so that they do what ought not to be done.



They are darkened in their understanding, being alienated from the life of God because of the ignorance that is in them due to the hardness of their hearts. Because they are callous, they have given themselves over to indecency for the practice of every kind of impurity with greediness.

ALL PEOPLE will face judgment at the end of the age.
You will still be held accountable for your actions.

1. No matter how much you suppress the truth about God, you still know something about God. People still have an innate understanding that there is "a God" (even though they suppress anything they can about this God).

For since the creation of the world his invisible attributes—his eternal power and divine nature—have been clearly seen, because they are understood through what has been made. So people are without excuse.

Ro 1:20 (NET)

"Yet [God] has not left himself without testimony: He has shown kindness by giving you rain from heaven and crops in their seasons; he provides you with plenty of food and fills your hearts with joy."

Acts 14:17 (NIV)

2. You still know that you deserve death. You know that certain types of conduct are right or wrong. You know that certain types of conduct deserve punishment.

They show that the requirements of the law are written on their hearts, their consciences also bearing witness, and their thoughts sometimes accusing them and at other times even defending them.

Romans 2:16 (NIV)

Although they know God's righteous decree that those who do such things deserve death, they not only continue to do these very things but also approve of those who practice them.

Ro 1:32 (NIV)

Whether you are condemning others, or excusing yourself—either way, your actions demonstrate your awareness that "something" is right, and another "something" is wrong... even if your views about those "somethings" are mixed-up.

Is GOD "UNFAIR"? Those who think lightly about sin may think so. However: 1. People will receive only the judgment they deserve. 2. Later generations will receive only what they deserve, based on their own knowledge (and violation) of the truth. 3. We should also be aware that God has no obligation to save anyone, anywhere, at any time. There are only TWO possible ways that God can be "unfair": 1. When God delays people's judgment (instead of immediate retribution), and lets them continue in their sin – perhaps we could call this "unfair"? At least we don't deserve the delay. 2. When God let Jesus experience the wrath WE deserve, even though he never sinned, so that those who repent may be saved. That's definitely "unfair" to Jesus!

- For God to take back the world, he needs ① a <u>nation</u> of people, ② a <u>land</u> for them to live in; and ③ the people need to <u>learn</u> about <u>how God-honoring people are to live</u>.
- √ This covenant was temporary... but special.
 - Its purpose was to teach the people how to live as the people of God. It did not save people; for that wasn't its purpose.
- God was actively involved in the making of this covenant
 - God wrote the commandments that were on the stone tablets.
 - God was visibly present in some of the activities related to the making of the covenant. [This visible presence was most likely a temporary physical manifestation of Jesus Christ, prior to his birth in Bethlehem.]
 - The glory of God would be visibly present over the Ark of the Covenant.

✓ The FIRST sten: God would call one person, Abram (= Abraham), to trust him. UNSAVED Then he would "grow" a God-fearing WORLD nation* from that one person. The "God-fearing" part hasn't yet happened 100%... but it will. The Lord had said to Abram, "Go from your [ABRAM] country, your people and your father's household to the land I will show you." "... I will bless you..." [etc.] Genesis 12:1, 2b (NIV) ✓ Many things would have to occur, before this entire covenant could be fulfilled. Many things are still occurring, as God moves world events toward this goal. The SECOND step: For reaching this goal, God will next introduce the Mosaic Covenant.

Compared to some of the other covenants:

- ✓ Like many other covenants (similarities):
 - It was structured like a typical Mideastern treaty of that time.
 - It contained blessings for obedience and cursings (judgments) for disobedience
 - It was confirmed with an oath Exodus 24:3, 7.
 - It was sealed by blood Exodus 24:6, 8.
 - There were witnesses and a meal Exodus 24:9-10.
 - There were signs and symbols Exodus 24:4 (12 stone pillars);
 Exodus 31:12-18 (the Sabbath).
- ✓ Unlike most other covenants in Scripture (differences):
 - It was conditional: It depended on the people's obedience.
 - It was intended to be temporary to be eventually replaced by the New Covenant.

Obeying this covenant would result in special blessings.

- ✓ As a treaty between the King and the people, it required obedience.
 - Both parties would agree to the terms, and the treaty (covenant) would be ratified with blood (etc.).
- This obedience would result in a special relationship between the King (God) and the subjects (Israel).
 - God would treat them as special, above all other nations.

Now if you obey me fully and keep my covenant, then out of all nations you will be my treasured possession.

Although the whole earth is mine, you will be for me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation.

Exodux 19:5-6a (NIV)

 If they obeyed, Israel would become an example to the world of what righteousness was all about.

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✓ Obeying the laws of this covenant would show the other nations:

- 1. The wisdom and understanding of the people.
- 2. The greatness of the God of Israel (who is near to his people).
- 3. The rightness of the laws themselves.

Look, I have taught you statutes and ordinances as the LORD my God has commanded me ... Carefully follow them, for this will show your wisdom and understanding in the eyes of the peoples. When they hear about all these statutes, they will say, 'This great nation is indeed a wise and understanding people.'

For what great nation is there that has a god near to it as the LORD our God is to us whenever we call to him?

And what great nation has righteous statutes and ordinances like this entire law I set before you today?

Deuteronomy 4:5a, 6-8 (CSB)

⇒ However, the Mosaic Covenant had one weakness.

- ✓ It can <u>show</u> people how to live... but it can't <u>cause</u> them to live that way.
 - Since people are under the control of sin, they don't (and can't) fully obey. Only those willing to <u>trust</u> God will be able to do this... and they won't do it perfectly.
 - Only Jesus Christ has fully obeyed the obligations of the Mosaic Covenant, He alone was without sin.
- √ The Law requires perfect obedience, or we will receive its curse.

 Since we do sin (by nature and by choice), we earn the curse.

All who rely on works of the law are under a curse. For it is written: "Cursed is everyone who does not continue to do everything written in the Book of the Law."

Galatians 3:10 (BSB)

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Did the Mosaic Covenant fail?

- ✓ It "failed" to do <u>only</u> what it <u>wasn't designed</u> to do.
 - It was NOT designed to change people's hearts, but to show them how to live in a way that honors God.
 - It was NOT designed to save people, but to show saved people how to live

 We shouldn't be surprised when it doesn't do things it wasn't supposed to do! This is a basic principle in all of life!

EXAMPLE: Airplanes were designed to land in a certain way. Trying to land them in ways they were not designed to land will result in problems!





TODAY, THERE ARE MANY <u>WRONG</u> VIEWS ABOUT THE MOSAIC COVENANT.

- √ Some people speak against it; others stress (and misuse) it.
 - In the New Testament, we can find some passages that tell us its value, and other passages that oppose its misuse.
- ✓ People tend to have a one-sided focus.
 - They may look at passages that emphasize one issue, and then ignore (or distance themselves from) passages that focus on other issues
- ✓ Context is often ignored which often leads to wrong conclusions.
 - In many passages, the word "law" may refer to a specific aspect of the Mosaic Covenant, and not other aspects of it.
 - For instance: In one passage, "law" may be referring to the sacrifices; in another passage, it may refer to the moral law.

ISSUES PERTAINING TO THE MOSAIC COVENANT:

- Does the Mosaic Covenant have any application to us today?
 If so, to what extent? (You may have heard different people express different views. We hope to sort them out.)
- Under the New Covenant, God's laws are written in our hearts. Are they the same laws that we find in the Old Covenant (all or part of them)? Or are they different ones?

ISSUES PERTAINING TO SIN:

• Sin is a serious matter. What does Scripture tell us – things that will help us to <u>not</u> fall into the snares of the devil?

We need to sort these things out, because they have a significant impact on how we are to live (or *not* live), as followers of Jesus... under the *New* Covenant.
