The call to holiness.

# HOLINESS: Being set apart ⇒ separated in some way from other things.

(Different contexts will result in somewhat different focuses.)

#### Holiness can be related to:

- A moral issue such as good vs. evil.
- A difference in *nature* such as God vs. humans.
- Something that is <u>special</u> vs. common or every-day.
   (This last category is not our focus here; but we can learn principles from such passages.)



Unless we <u>pursue</u> holiness, we will never really <u>understand</u> holiness.



### GOD IS HOLY...

- ✓ He is the uncreated God, <u>separate</u> from all creation yet <u>connected</u> to it (through Jesus, who is both God and human).
- ✓ He is *totally separated* from all sin and evil.

### ... AND HE REQUIRES US TO BE HOLY.

- ✓ We were created in the "image of God," <u>separate</u> from the rest of creation (because God created us in his image) though <u>connected</u> (to it because of our physical bodies).
- ✓ We are to be totally separated from all sin and evil.

Through Jesus Christ, we – who were born as <u>sinners</u> – can become holy, with all that is a part of it:

- ✓ a devoted loyalty to the only uncreated God;
  - ✓ a special covenantal relationship with him;
- ✓ the goal of becoming like him in moral purity.

# Everything about God is holy (1).

- ✓ The Father is holy. John 17:11; Revelation 4:8; 6:10.
- The Son (Jesus) is holy. John 6:69; John 10:36 (sanctified/set apart); Acts 3:14. Even the demons admit it! Mark 1:24 Luke 4:34.
- ▼ The Holy Spirit is holy. After all, he is the HOLY Spirit!
- ✓ His name is holy. (His "name" represents him and all he is.)

... the Lord ... God my Savior ... the Mighty One ... — holy is his name. Luke 1:46b, 47b, 49 (NIV)

\* Every time we say the "Lord's Prayer," we admit it... But do we mean it?

Many translations say, "Hallowed be Your name." This means... Our Father in heaven,
[may] your name be
honored as holy.
Matthew 6:9b (CSB)

### Everything about God is holy (2).

- His Word is holy. Romans 1:2; also 2 Timothy 3:15 ("sacred," a similar concept).
- ✓ His law and commandments are holy. Romans 7:12.
- \* The apostates are the ones who know about God's holy commandments... and then don't obey

For it would have been better for them never to have known the way of righteousness than, having known it, to turn back from the holy commandment that had been delivered to them.

2 Peter 2:21 (NET)

What is <u>our</u> attitude toward God, his name and his Word? ... as evidenced by our actions and words?

### All humans have an obligation to be holy.

✓ Since we were created in God's image, we are to be like God in holiness (though on the level of a created being). This obligation is NOT just for saved people!

... for it is written: "Be holy, because I am holy."

1 Peter 1:16 (NIV)

# Yet only the SAVED can fulfil this obligation.

- √ <u>All</u> humans have pursued the way of sin; but God has offered to restore to holiness those who are willing to submit to Jesus Christ.
- ✓ This offer is made available by means of his Word the message
  of the Bible, the Good News. As Jesus prayed...

Make them holy by the true word: your word is the true word.  $_{\rm John~17:17~(BBE)}$ 



In this Word, we find everything necessary for life and godliness.



# IF WE CHOOSE TO FOLLOW JESUS, WE WILL DISCOVER THAT GOD HAS AN ACTIVE ROLE IN OUR BECOMING HOLY.\*

(We will look at human responsibility later. We do have obligations.)

In Scripture, God reveals what  $\underline{\textit{he}}$  has done in these matters. He tells us these things in order to encourage us who choose to pursue holiness.

- ✓ It gives us hope. The more we understand our sinfulness, the more we realize how hopeless our condition would be, if God weren't involved
- It guarantees the outcome. In Scripture, we discover that God not only makes holiness possible, but also guarantees the success of those who are willing to follow Jesus.
- ✓ It does not cancel human responsibility. Scripture is filled with reminders that a genuine salvation (= one that God is involved in) is an ongoing salvation (= one in which we are willing to continue).
- \* (The only reason we know about these things is because the Bible tells us.)

# Scripture tells us that, for we who are following Jesus, God is actively involved in our becoming holy.

✓ God chose us to be holy.

For [God] chose us in [Christ] before the foundation of the world to be **holy** and blameless in His presence.

Ephesians 1:4 (BSB)

✓ NOT because of any merit in <u>us</u>... but simply because he chose to.

For God saved us and called us to live a holy life. He did this, not because we deserved it, but because that was his plan from before the beginning of time—to show us his grace through Christ Jesus.

2 Timothy 1:9 (NLT)

✓ And he made it possible through Jesus' sacrifice for us.

For God's will was for us to be made holy by the sacrifice of the body of Jesus Christ, once for all time.

Hebrews 10:10 (NLT)

### In his Word, God reveals to us our obligation to be holy.

(Scripture is the only way a sinner can accurately know his obligation.)

✓ Holiness is our obligation.

But just as he who called you is holy, so be holy in all you do ... 1 Peter 1:15 (NIV)

✓ Holiness is God's will for our lives – his desire and our moral duty.

For it is God's will that you should be holv ...

1 Thessalonians 4:3 (BSB)

✓ If we have chosen to follow Jesus, holiness is our calling.

God has called us to live holy lives, not impure lives. 1 Thessalonians 4:7 (NLT)

#### God reveals how serious this matter of holiness is.

✓ Without it, we cannot "see the Lord." (Those without holiness will be cast out of his presence forever.)

> ... without holiness no one will see the Lord. Hebrews 12:14b (NIV)

✓ We will need to be disciplined, in order attain holiness.

... God's discipline is always good for us, so that we might share in his holiness.

Heb 12:10b (NLT)

This is not the same as punishment. It may include punishment, if necessary; but it also includes training, correction, testing, and more – whatever is necessary to grow us into people that share in his holiness.

✓ It also requires Jesus to die in our place. •

# Scripture tells us that Jesus made our holiness possible.

The book of Hebrews tells us a lot about how he accomplished this. It also shows us the parallels between what Jesus did, and the Old Covenant temple practices (which were intended to picture what he would do).

✓ He made himself holy (as a sacrifice), in order to make us holy. And I give myself as a holy sacrifice for them so they can be made holy by your truth. John 17:19 (NLT)

The word "sacrifice is implied. He was preparing for his death.

✓ It's fully accomplished – paid in full – once for all time. There will never be a need for another sacrifice!

> For by that one offering he forever made perfect those who are being made holy. Heb 12:14 (NLT)

★ What he did is 100% sufficient to accomplish its purpose. ★

# More than that, Jesus is our holiness!

✓ If we are "in Christ," he is our holiness.

... Christ Jesus, who has become for us wisdom from God: our righteousness, holiness, and redemption.

1 Corinthians 1:30b (BSB)

In ourselves, we have no holiness. When we become followers of Jesus, it's <u>Jesus'</u> holiness that we receive.

In Christ, God already sees us as holy. Yet from the "human responsibility" perspective, we need to pursue becoming holy.\* It needs to become the controlling factor in our lives. Then the world will see what God already sees!

\* (God has already given his people the desire and the power do this – Ephesians 6:10, Philippians 2:13; Hebrews 10:16; etc.)

# The Holy Spirit is also involved, enabling us to *live* holy lives.

✓ The Spirit brings what Jesus did into our lives! He works to accomplish God's plans.

God planned long ago ... to make you his holy people, which is the Spirit's work.

1 Peter 1:2a (ERV)

✓ He uses our trust in the truth of Scripture.

You are saved by the Spirit making you holy and by your faith in the truth.

2 Thessalonians 2:13b (ERV)

✓ He applies <u>to</u> us what Jesus accomplished <u>for</u> us.

But you were washed clean, you were made holy, and you were made right with God in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God.

1 Corinthians 6:11b (ESV)

### WHAT MUST WE DO?

### We have a wonderful future to look forward to!

We have an inheritance! That's the final outcome of accepting and living by the Good News – as Paul says twice in the book of Acts:

... the <u>inheritance</u> that is shared by all of God's holy people.

Acts 20:32b (GW)

'... a <u>share</u> among God's people who are made holy by believing in me [= Jesus].'

Acts 26:18 (GW)

Sod and will enable us to receive the inheritance that is reserved for *holy* people!

BUT WHAT HAPPENS IN THE <u>FUTURE</u> ALSO HAS A DIRECT CONNECTION TO WHAT WE DO <u>NOW.</u>

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## We need to reinforce in our minds the need to be holy.

### 1. We must oppose the ways of the world.

✓ The <u>world</u> is constantly telling us that we <u>don't</u> need to be holy! (It is doing so every time it tempts us to sin.) We must oppose this!

You used to walk in these [sinful] ways, in the life you once lived. But now you must also rid yourselves of all such things as these: [here is a description of <u>sinful</u> conduct]. ...

Therefore, as God's chosen people, **holy** and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with [here is a description of <u>righteous</u> conduct].

Colossians 3:7-8a, 12a (NIV)

If we have this changed focus, we have a *glorious* future to look forward to. (See verses 2-4.)

#### 2. We must oppose the ways of the *flesh*.

✓ Our own "<u>flesh</u>" (sinful nature) wants us to use our bodies for sin. But we have a <u>different</u> obligation: use them for righteousness.

Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship.

Romans 12:1 (NIV)

Just as you used to offer the parts of your body in slavery to impurity and to escalating wickedness, so now offer them in slavery to righteousness leading to holiness.

Romans 6:19b (BSB)

If we have this changed focus, we have eternal life to look forward to. (See verse 22.)

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# Some of the *blessings* of holiness begin <u>now;</u> but they are linked to our *obligations*.



BLESSING: God's promises belong to us!
OBLIGATION: We must pursue moral purity.



 Our experience of holiness may be imperfect; but we must <u>pursue</u> perfection! How should we do it? Here is the way!

Therefore, since we have these promises, dear friends, let us purify ourselves from everything that contaminates body and spirit, perfecting holiness out of reverence for God.

2 Corinthians 7:1 (NIV)

This "reverence" is often translated as "fear." It shows us that certain types of fear are both *good* and *godly*. (Others aren't.)

MORE DETAILS ABOUT THESE PROMISES AND OUR OBLIGATION.

✓ Here are the PROMISES:

This passage describes it as a promise. Hebrews (next page) describes it as a reality.

✓ Here is our OBLIGATION:

This verse tells us what we must turn our focus from. Hebrews (next page) tells us who we must turn our focus to.

"I will live with them and walk among them, and I will be their God, and they will be my people." ...

And,

"I will be a Father to you, and you will be my sons and daughters, says the Lord Almighty." 2 Corinthians 6:16, 18 (NIV)

e is our OBLIGATION:

Therefore,
"Come out from them
and be separate,
says the Lord.
Touch no unclean thing,
and I will receive you."
2 Corinthians 6:17 (NIV)

# BLESSING: We become part of God's family! OBLIGATION: We must keep our focus on Jesus!



✓ What Jesus did makes it possible. And it brings us into his family!


Jesus, the one who makes people holy, and those who are made holy are from the same family. So he is not ashamed to call them his brothers and sisters.

Hebrews 2:11 (ERV)

He has called us to be holy and to be his brothers and sisters. Our obligation is to focus on Jesus and on what he has accomplished ... and to respond properly!

> Therefore, holy brothers and sisters, who share in the heavenly calling, fix your thoughts on Jesus, ... We have come to share in Christ, if indeed we hold our original conviction firmly to the very end. Hebrews 3:1a, 14 (NIV)

(Genuine faith is ongoing. Don't turn away from God, like Israel did.)



Colossians 1:21-23 (BSB)

### NOW is the time to prepare for the future judgment.

✓ There is a coming judgment of fire, followed by a new heaven and a new earth. This fact should influence how we live!

Since everything will be destroyed in this way, what kind of people ought you to be? You ought to live holy and godly lives as you look forward to the day of God and speed its coming.

2 Peter 3:11-12a (NIV)

 $\checkmark$  The time is coming when change will be no longer possible.

This verse, near the end of the book of Revelation, appears to be a warning that, from that time on, we will stay the way we are...

"Let the one who does wrong <u>continue</u> to do wrong; let the vile person <u>continue</u> to be vile; let the one who does right <u>continue</u> to do right; and let the holy person <u>continue</u> to be holy."

Revelation 22:11 (NIV)

# **OUR MISSION:**

# **WE MUST PURSUE HOLINESS NOW!**

SIN never was an option; only sinners pretend it is.

When we pursue HOLINESS, we are just doing what we were originally created to do.

If <u>we</u> are <u>willing</u> to pursue holiness, <u>God</u> will <u>make sure</u> we attain holiness!

May the God who gives peace make you holy in every way. May he keep your whole being—spirit, soul, and body—blameless when our Lord Jesus Christ comes.

The one who calls you is faithful, and he will do this. 1 Thes. 5:23-24 (GW)

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
