





















Here are some of the COMMANDS that teach us about our need to do good works!

We need to be devoted to good works. They are to be the primary focus of our lives.

This saying is trustworthy. And I want you to emphasize these things, so that those who have believed God will take care to devote themselves to good deeds. These things are excellent and profitable for the people.

Titus 3:8b (BSB)

This passage tells us that there are certain facts that need to be stressed. WHY? Because people who believe these facts will be careful to devote themselves to good deeds!

★ TRUSTWORTHY THINGS THAT NEED STRESSED. ★ (They will influence our attitude toward good works.)

- The effects that being re-born to new life will have on the old way we used to live (= the "old self") – Titus 3:1-7.
- The effects that God's grace has on a person's conduct Titus 2:11-15. Paul focuses directly on the relationship between God's grace and our conduct (i.e., good works):

For the grace of God ... teaches us to say "No" to ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright and godly lives in this present age, ... [Jesus Christ] gave himself for us to redeem us from all wickedness and to purify for himself a people that are his very own, eager to do what is good.

Titus 2:11a, 12, 14 (NIV)

What will be the result of learning these things?

- ✓ Our works will benefit others who are in need.
- ✓ We won't have a wasted life unproductive or unfruitful.

Our people must learn to devote themselves to doing what is good, in order to provide for urgent needs and not live unproductive lives.

Titus 3:14 (NIV)

 \checkmark Here is another way to say it (= a different translation):

Our people must learn to use their lives for doing good and helping anyone who has a need.

Then they will not have empty lives.

Titus 3:14 (ERV)

NOTE THE FOCUS. Works that are the *result* of salvation are *other-people-*focused, not *self-*focused. Sometimes they *may* benefit us; but we do them *whether or not* <u>we</u> *benefit* from them. (We may even have to suffer because of them.)

These good works are to encompass <u>all of life</u>. This means <u>everything</u> we do (or say) is to honor God.

And whatever you do in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus. ...

Colossians 3:17a (NET)

"In Jesus' name" means we do it as his representative and for his honor/glory.

So whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do everything for the glory of God.

1 Corinthians 10:31 (NET)

✓ When we live this way, we don't have to be afraid of people finding out about our works. We can give credit to God!

"But anyone who lives by the truth comes to the light, so that his works may be shown to be accomplished by God."

John 3:21 (CSB)

ATTITUDE ISSUES – How should we do our good works?

In some of these verses, we will see that good works are often *linked* to other godly characteristics.

Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters, since you know that you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as a reward. It is the Lord Christ you are serving.

Colossians 3:23-24 (NIV)

The principle in this verse applies to <u>any</u> situation in which a person is working for someone else.

CONSISTENTLY: Your actions should match what you say and teach. It can have eternal significance for both you and others.

Don't be like the religious leaders in Jesus' day, who did not practice what they taught (Matthew 23:3)!

✓ In the following verse, Paul focuses on the "human responsibility" aspect of <u>communicating</u> the Good News (and living consistently with its message). Salvation is by God's grace; but when God saves someone, he normally accomplishes it with people.

Watch your life and doctrine closely. Persevere in them, because if you do, you will save both yourself and your hearers.

1 Timothy 4:16 (NIV)

✓ Here is Paul's response when some people claimed that he would not actually <u>do</u> what his letters <u>said</u> he would do:

What we say by **letters** when we are absent, we also are in **actions** when we are present.

2 Corinthians 10:11 (NET)

➡ FOCUSED: Stay focused and do it well! It won't be a waste of your time!

Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain.

1 Corinthians 15:58 (NIV)

- ✓ When we do everything in a way that honors God (1 Corinthians 10:31), then it's <u>his</u> work we are doing!
- ➡ THANKFULLY: Do it with a grateful heart. Consider what God has done for us. We have an opportunity to follow his example by doing good for others! (We will also be doing it for Jesus.)

And whatever you do in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

Colossians 3:17 (NET)

(Three other issues.)

1. Works that please God are an expression of <u>love</u>. (They are also connected to <u>faith</u> and <u>truth</u>).

Rather, serve each other through love.

Galatians 5:13b (GW)

... your work produced by faith, your labor motivated by love, ...

1 Thessalonians 1:3b (CSB)

Dear children, let's not merely say that we love each other; let' us show the truth by our actions. Our actions will show that we belong to the truth, ...

1 John 3:18-19a (NLT)

✓ The work of opposing false teachers is also an expression of love (1 Timothy 1:5; context vs. 3-7). Our goal is their repentance and salvation, and other people's protection from error and destruction.

2. We are to "work out" our salvation... because God is enabling us to do so!

★ GOD IS AT WORK IN AND THROUGH US! ★

... continue to work out your salvation with fear and trembling. For it is God who is producing in you both the desire and the ability to do what pleases him.

Philippians 2:12b-13 (ISV)

- Unfortunately, many people mistakenly think that "working <u>out</u>" your salvation is the same as "working <u>for</u>" your salvation. They also tend to ignore verse 13, which tells us that <u>God</u> is the one who enables this "working out."
- The <u>salvation</u> that is <u>already</u> in us expresses itself with <u>good</u> <u>works</u> flowing <u>out</u> from us, and <u>into</u> the lives of other people.

 Jesus knows our works. We can't fool him. This can be an encouragement or a warning, depending on what our works are. Examples from the book of Revelation:

- At Ephesus: Praised for works they were doing (2:2); rebuked because of works they had begun to neglect (v. 4-5).
- At Thyatira: One group praised for their works (2:19); another group to be destroyed if they don't repent of their sin (v. 20-23).
- At Sardis: A good reputation among people; but their deeds were seriously flawed... like an empty shell... dead or dying (3:1-2).
- ✓ At Philadelphia: Weak, but faithful; encouraged by Jesus (3:8).
- At Laodicea: Lukewarm, superficial; thinking they were "everything," when they were actually "nothing" (3:15-16).

Whether we are a genuine follower of Jesus, or a fake... Either way, we can be assured of this: Jesus says...

I will repay each of you according to your deeds.

Revelation 2:23b (BSB)

YOUR (OUR) MISSION!

APPRECIATE the importance of good works!

They are an expression of a *living* salvation!

The more we let Scripture influence our thinking, values and conduct ...

... the more we will succeed in living this life.
